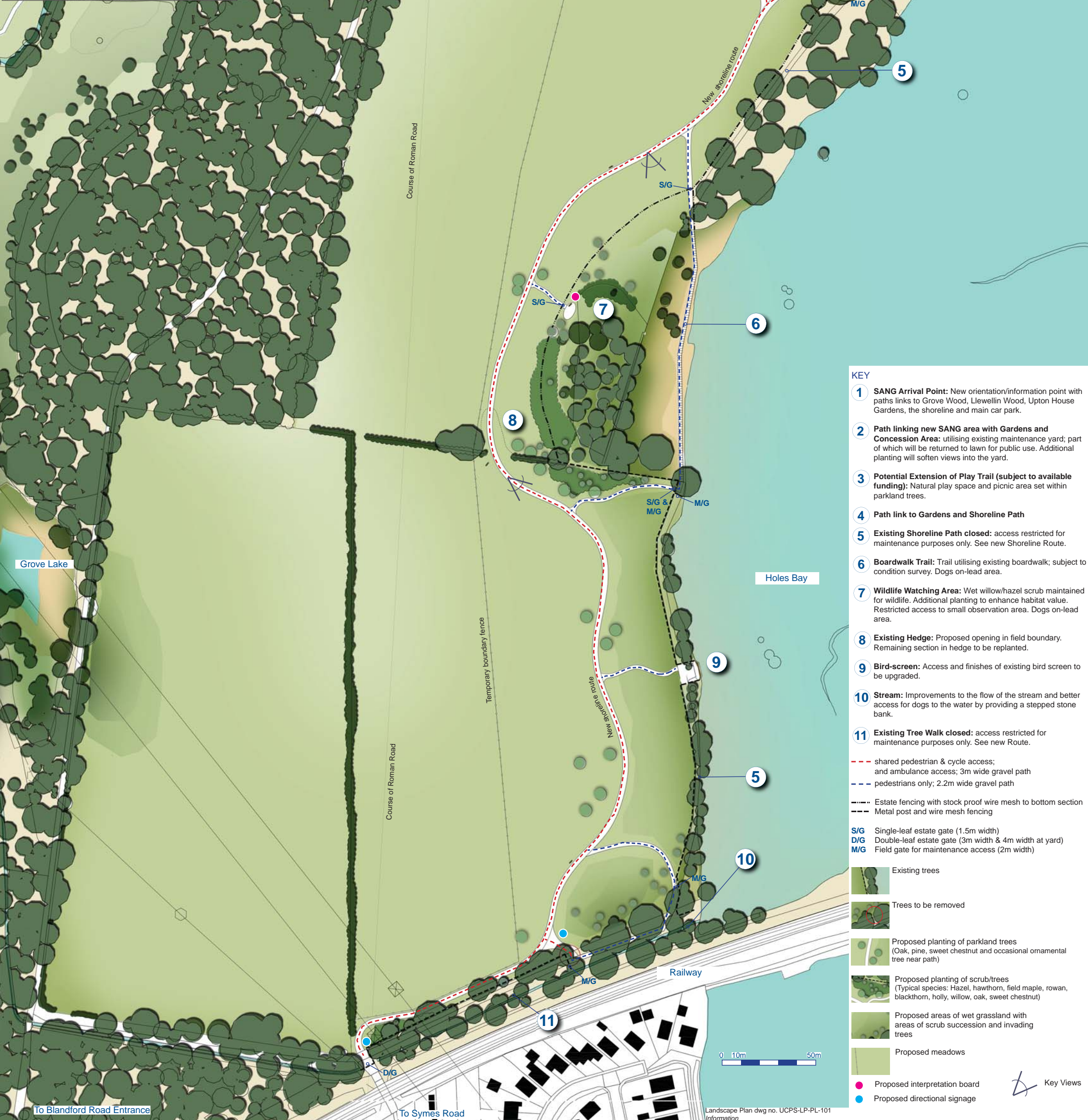
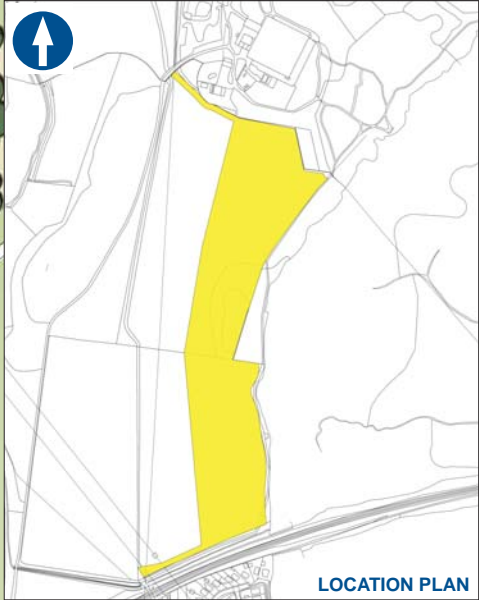


UPTON COUNTRY PARK EXTENSION: 2016-17

'UPTON FIELDS'



- KEY**
- 1 SANG Arrival Point:** New orientation/information point with paths links to Grove Wood, Llewelin Wood, Upton House Gardens, the shoreline and main car park.
 - 2 Path linking new SANG area with Gardens and Concession Area:** utilising existing maintenance yard; part of which will be returned to lawn for public use. Additional planting will soften views into the yard.
 - 3 Potential Extension of Play Trail (subject to available funding):** Natural play space and picnic area set within parkland trees.
 - 4 Path link to Gardens and Shoreline Path**
 - 5 Existing Shoreline Path closed:** access restricted for maintenance purposes only. See new Shoreline Route.
 - 6 Boardwalk Trail:** Trail utilising existing boardwalk; subject to condition survey. Dogs on-lead area.
 - 7 Wildlife Watching Area:** Wet willow/hazel scrub maintained for wildlife. Additional planting to enhance habitat value. Restricted access to small observation area. Dogs on-lead area.
 - 8 Existing Hedge:** Proposed opening in field boundary. Remaining section in hedge to be replanted.
 - 9 Bird-screen:** Access and finishes of existing bird screen to be upgraded.
 - 10 Stream:** Improvements to the flow of the stream and better access for dogs to the water by providing a stepped stone bank.
 - 11 Existing Tree Walk closed:** access restricted for maintenance purposes only. See new Route.
- - - shared pedestrian & cycle access; and ambulance access; 3m wide gravel path
 - - - pedestrians only; 2.2m wide gravel path
 - - - Estate fencing with stock proof wire mesh to bottom section
 - - - Metal post and wire mesh fencing
 - S/G** Single-leaf estate gate (1.5m width)
 - D/G** Double-leaf estate gate (3m width & 4m width at yard)
 - M/G** Field gate for maintenance access (2m width)
- Existing trees
 - Trees to be removed
 - Proposed planting of parkland trees (Oak, pine, sweet chestnut and occasional ornamental tree near path)
 - Proposed planting of scrub/trees (Typical species: Hazel, hawthorn, field maple, rowan, blackthorn, holly, willow, oak, sweet chestnut)
 - Proposed areas of wet grassland with areas of scrub succession and invading trees
 - Proposed meadows
 - Proposed interpretation board
 - Proposed directional signage
